


Curbside Recycling in Fulton

The City of Fulton is proud to offer the opportunity to recycle to our citizens. Recycling is beneficial to our community in several ways. It helps to employ the disabled, prolongs the life of the landfill, reduces disposal costs, conserves our natural resources and teaches our children to be aware of the environment around them. We have tried to make recycling in Fulton as convenient as possible. I encourage all of you to follow the directions enclosed and make every effort to recycle.

Why Recycle?

Every ton of recycled paper:

- Saves 17 trees
- Saves 4,100 kwh of energy
- Reduces air pollution by 60 pounds
- Saves 7,000 gallons of water
- Saves 3 cubic yards of landfill space

It takes 20 times more energy to make an aluminum can out of ore than it does out of an old aluminum can.

Americans use 2.5 million plastic bottles each day and if the pilgrims had plastic it would still be with us today.

Missouri landfills over 5 million tons of trash each year. That's about one ton for every person.

Special Waste Disposal

Because of environmental laws, some items can not be collected at the curb in your normal household trash. They must be disposed of separately. Please call the following people for assistance.

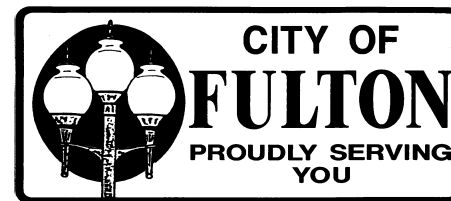

Non-recyclable Items

Everything is theoretically recyclable. However many items are not practical to recycle. We try to recycle as much as we can and still keep costs down. Therefore, **the following items should not** be put out for recycling.

1. Glass Jars and Bottles

Glass and recycling has changed. Glass bottles and jars break during collection and cause a health hazard to the collectors sorting the materials. Broken glass also contaminates the recycled paper so it cannot be sold. Please put your glass bottles and jars in your trash container.

2. Glass mirrors, window glass, ceramics, dishes or vases.

3. Pesticides, paint and other chemicals.

4. Wide mouth plastic containers (plastic butter bowls, yogurt containers), toys, hard plastic items.

5. Paper towels, tissue, food stained items.

6. Trash and garbage

Curbside Recycling

The City of Fulton is proud to offer curbside recycling to our residents. By recycling a portion of our trash we can reduce our costs, save space in our landfill, and conserve valuable resources for our children and grandchildren.

Do I have to recycle?

No, this is strictly voluntary but we certainly would encourage you to participate.

How much will it cost?

Curbside recycling is free for all Fulton residents whether you participate or not.

How much can I save by recycling?

If you are currently paying for a second trash container, recycling may reduce your trash volumes enough to eliminate one container.

What can be recycled?

The list on the right describes what can be recycled, and list on the left is what cannot be recycled.

When are recyclables picked-up?

The South side of town has pick-up on Tuesday and the North side on Wednesday. **Collection starts at 6 am.**

Do I have to buy clear bags? **NO**

However, operators need to be able to tell the items are recyclable. You can use plastic grocery bags. Bags need to be tied so items do not blow around.

Do holidays affect the schedule?

Recycling will not be collected on holiday weeks or during spring and fall clean-up weeks. Save your recycling for the following week.

Recyclable Items

About fifty percent of our household trash is recyclable. Recycling can reduce the use of Extra trash containers and will make our City more “environmentally responsible”.

The following items should be prepared as described below, put into plastic bags, and placed on the curb for recycling.

Plastic Bottles and Cans, without lids

Rinse out your containers, throw away the lid. The labels do not need to be removed. Put the following containers in clear plastic or grocery bags. Tie the bag close.

- Aluminum Cans
- Steel or tin food cans
- Soda or water bottles
- Milk, juice jugs, liquid soap bottles
- Plastic Bags, film, plastic wrap

Paper

Put your clean, dry, paper into a separate plastic bag or tie together as a bundle. The following paper items are recyclable.

- Newspapers and Magazines
- Junk mail and Books
- Office or school paper
- Food or cereal boxes
- Paper, bags, laundry soap boxes

Cardboard boxes

Flatten and tie in bundles. Put them under your recyclable bags.

Clothes and Shoes (New for 2006)

Bag or bundle items, no heavier than 50 lbs.
